Questions Students Can Ask Themselves When Solving a Problem

Did I read the question carefully?

Do I understand what the question is asking me to solve?

Is this question like another question I have solved before? Could I use the same approach?

What other strategies might I use to solve this problem?

Are there math resources I could use to help me better understand this problem?

Would drawing a picture help me solve this problem?

Am I showing my thinking?

Can I talk through the problem in my head?

Can I explain my approach to a classmate?

Am I at the point where I need to ask for help?

Did I meet the success criteria? How do I know?

How do I know my answer is correct?

Questions Students Can Ask Themselves at the End of the Day

Did I ask for help when I needed it?

Did I participate in class discussion?

Did I listen to other ideas and approaches?

How did I learn best today?

When did I struggle? What might I do differently next time?

What skills do I need to practice more?

What was the most important thing I learned today?

What surprised me about what I learned today?

Can I apply what I learned today to different math situations?

Can what I learned today help me solve a real-life problem?

What would I like to learn tomorrow?
